is a rapidly expanding metropolitan college with its main campus located in the historic city of Paterson, New Jersey. PCCC opened its doors in October 1971 with 324 students in seven programs of study. Today, the college operates four campuses in Paterson, Wayne, Wanaque, and Passaic - all just minutes from New York City - and enrolls more than 7.500 student The continuing expansion of the College and its opportunities is the result of visionary leadership by Dr. Steven Rose, president of PCCC, and a forward-thinking administration. With an award-winning faculty, diverse academic programs, and convenient day, evening, Interactive Television (ITV) and online courses, PCCC offers a flexible, high quality education that prepares students for the rigors of a four-year college or for the demands of today's workplace, especially in a major metropolitan area.

Students at PCCC choose from more than 50 Associate Degree and certificate programs that include liberal arts, computer technology, nursing, fire science, criminal justice, exercise science, early childhood education, and much more. Modern classrooms, state-of-the art computer and science labs, a new theater and library, and fully-equipped athletic facilities enhance the educational experience.

The extremely diverse student body at PCCC reflects the multicultural richness of a cosmopolitan location and encourages an open, welcoming campus environment as well as unique and customized learning options. The Continuing Education/Workforce Development department offers non-credit lifelong learning opportunities, such as Preparation for U.S. Citizenship, How to Start Your Own Business, and English for the Workplace, among others.

PCCC maintains an Honors Program, an annual forensics competition, a theatre program, leadership development opportunities, more than 30 vigorous student clubs and an array of activities to expand the college experience beyond the classroom.

Collegiality

Students and faculty alike affirm the collegial and congenial atmosphere of PCCC.

"Professors here really care about you and help you to succeed," said Jessica Hoffman, valedictorian of the Class of 2008. Language professor Zirka Voronka agreed, "The supportive environment at PCCC fits my philosophy of education and of life. There is a human kindness here, and students are offered a path to their self-realization.

Classroom to Community...And Back

That path often extends well beyond the classroom. Business professor Lucia Gheorghiu takes classes on field trips to financial centers, such as the New York Stock Exchange, so they can see their lessons applied in the "real world." Her students also collaborate with the local community on projects and staff of PCCC. for environmental and social improvement.

Our Mission

The PCCC Panthers have a long and rich tradition of athletic achievement. Our athletic programs are an integral part of the "whole person" educational concept at PCCC, fostering intellectual, social, and physical development. We seek student-athletes who embrace and model the character and values of "Respect, Responsibility, Integrity, Sportsmanship and Servant Leadership." In return, we provide them with the resources and guidance necessary to compete at their highest level, pursue academic excellence, and prepare for productive lives after college.

Athletic Programs

PCCC offers four intercollegiate sports: Men's and Women's Basketball, Women's Volleyball, and Men's Soccer. PCCC is a member of the NJCAA Region 19 and Garden State Athletic Conference and we compete within the NJCAA Division III. Our athletic teams are very competitive and have achieved conference and regional titles. Our men's

and women's basketball teams have advanced to the NJCAA National Tournament and received high pre-season and post-season national rankings. The men's soccer team and women's volleyball team have also advanced to regional conference tournaments. Coach Rich Corsetto, head men's basketball coach, has achieved over 390 career wins, several 20-win seasons and numerous conference and Region 19 championships.

Facilities

In 2008, PCCC completed the project to upgrade and revitalize the fitness and student centers which are located on the main campus. The renewed fitness center is spacious and features state-of-the-art equipment to enhance cardiovascular and strength training. Nearby, the new student center now offers the latest gaming equipment, including ice hockey and pool tables. Both centers are open to the student body, faculty
