The following are the minutes of the Board of Trustees of Passaic County Community College, One College Boulevard, Paterson, New Jersey, held on Tuesday, March 17, 2015.

CALL TO ORDER

President Rose stated that notice of the meeting was mailed to the Herald News, the Record, the Office of the County Clerk, and posted on the bulletin board of the College Boulevard building on December 1, 2014.

Chairman Nutter stated that inasmuch as adequate notice of the meeting had been given, the meeting was called to order at 7:02 p.m. A copy of the agenda was reviewed and available for public inspection.

CONSIDERATION OF MINUTES – January 20, 2014

Chairman Nutter asked for a motion on Resolution #1 – Consideration of Minutes for January 20, 2015; moved by Trustee Tanis, seconded by Trustee Esquiche. Upon roll call, Resolution #1 passed with all members present voting "yes."

PRESENTATION

Academic Items: Dr. Jacqueline Kineavy, Senior Vice President for Academic and Student Affairs was pleased to present the following academic programs that would provide more opportunities to the student population. A brief summary on each follows:

The Associate in Science in Public Health is a sixty (60) credit degree program designed to provide graduates with skills and knowledge consistent with the critical components of an undergraduate degree in Public Health. The degree credits are transferable through articulation agreements with Montclair State University and William Paterson University. In addition, this

program prepares graduates for employment as public health professionals' health-related professions such as public heath generalist and health educator positions.

The Associate in Applied Science in Culinary Arts is a sixty-eight (68) credit degree program that will provide a solid foundation in Culinary Arts allowing students to acquire a broad range of technical skills relevant to the food service industry. Graduates of this program will be employable by restaurants, hotels, casinos or as entrepreneurs starting their own food service business.

The Career Certificate in Baking is a thirty-two (32) credit program that will prepare students to complete basic technical baking skills. This program will also prepare students for employment in the baking and restaurant industry as an entry-level baker or pastry cook. In addition, this certificate serves as an academic ladder into the Associate in Applied Science in Culinary degree.

The change in status is for the Associate in Arts in Liberal Arts – English Option to become an Associate in Arts in English degree. The decision to evolve from option to degree has been guided by the desire to provide a comprehensive academic base for our students as they embark on further scholastic activities at a four year institution. The Associate in Arts in English will prepare students who plan to pursue a Bachelor of Arts in English, English Literature or related discipline(s) to pursue a degree at a four-year institution. The degree credits are transferable to four-year institutions such as Montclair State University, William Paterson University and Rutgers University.

REPORTS

<u>President</u>: President Rose informed the Board that the Assembly Budget Committee was holding its Public Hearing at Passaic County Community College on March 18. The event goes all day and sixty people have signed up to testify. Assemblyman Gary Schaer currently chairs this committee and this event was a first for the College.

The second item the President presented was the approval of the College's budget by the PCCC Board of School Estimate. He stated that the budget was the budget the Board of Trustees approved in January of this year. President Rose noted publicly how pleased he was to receive the full support of the Passaic County Board of Chosen Freeholders.

The final item President Rose presented was the trip to Washington, D.C. for the Association of Community College Trustees (ACCT) National Legislative Summit that he attended with several of the trustees and College Counsel. He was so pleased that community colleges were finally receiving national recognition via President Obama; Dr. Jill Biden, wife of the Vice President of the United States and a community college professor; and Mr. Al Franken, one of the keynote speakers.

Chairman Nutter, Trustee Esquiche, and Mr. Michael A. Cerone, Jr., College Counsel, echoed the President's comments and noted that this annual Summit was indeed a noteworthy event. It highlights the significance of community colleges and presents viable solutions for workforce development. The group also had the opportunity to meet Senator Cory Booker and his legislative aides, as well as Congressman Bill Pascrell, Jr and Congressman Rodney Frelinghuysen.
