CONSIDERATION OF MINUTES – May 16, 2017

Chairman Nutter asked for a motion on Resolution #1 – Consideration of Minutes for May 16, 2017; moved by Trustee DuHaime; seconded by Trustee Trivedi. Upon roll call, Resolution #1 passed with all members present voting "yes."

Paterson Light and Shadow

President Rose was pleased to introduce Ms. Maria Mazziotti Gillan, Executive Director of the Poetry Center and Cultural Affairs; and Professor Mark Hillringhouse of the English Department, to present their latest collaboration of Maria's poems and Mark's photographs.

Their synergistic effort produced the book each Board member was given entitled *Paterson Light* and Shadow.

In a joint presentation, Ms. Gillan and Professor Hillringhouse highlighted the making and thinking behind their collaboration, having lived and worked in the City of Paterson for many years, and felt that putting these two artistic venues together would not only showcase their talents to others, but also make the City of Paterson come alive with its rich history.

Both were pleased to have the opportunity to present their work to the Board and provided each member with a poster from the Great Falls National Park. Professor Hillringhouse was honored to state that his photograph of the great falls, the one shown on the cover of their book, was also the one the Great Falls National Park was using for their promotions as shown on the poster presented that evening.

Graduation Statistics

President Rose provided the historical information on the way the Federal Government calculates and defines a successful student, which was based on only first-time, full-time, who enrolled in the fall semester and graduate within three years. And he noted that while the higher education community considers that to be relatively meaningless, Members of Congress, and others, take them quite seriously.

Over the past several years, pressure has been building on accrediting agencies to pay particular attention to graduation rates in the accreditation process. In an outreach effort, the Middle States Commission on Higher Education (MSCHE, the accrediting body for the northeast) reached out to PCCC to provide an opportunity for the College to put its graduation rate in context. A copy of that letter and response were included in the Board packet.

Additionally, a chart provided by the New Jersey Council of County Colleges detailing trends in the degrees and certificates issued by the College was also included further detailing the complexities of graduation statistics. It was noted that PCCC leads the state in the percentage increase in both degrees and certificates awarded over the past several years.

A discussion then took place on that topic with additional insight provided by Dr. Jacqueline Kineavy, Senior Vice President for Academic and Student Affairs, who has been on many Middle States site visits and revered by MSCHE as an expert in the field. Her input into the response to the accrediting agency provided an outline of actions being taken by the College to address the issue of low graduation rates.

A. ACADEMIC ITEMS

The submission of the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Grant application for PCCC's one-year spending plan to the New Jersey Department of Education in the amount of \$709,425, for the period July 1, 2017 to June 30, 2018.

Articulation Agreements

The following Articulation Agreements have passed through the College's approval process: departmental review, Curriculum Committee, and Academic Council.

Montclair State University

The articulation agreement with Montclair State University (MSU) for PCCC graduates who earn an A.S. in Liberal Arts degree for the following options: Biology, Environmental Sustainability or Physical Science. PCCC graduates will be able to transfer into a variety of upper level science majors at MSU and work towards graduating with either a B.A. or a B.S. degree.

RESOLUTION #2-CONSENT RESOLUTION - ACTION ITEMS A, B, C, and D

Ramapo College of New Jersey

The articulation agreement with Ramapo College of New Jersey (RCNJ) for PCCC students who earn an A.S. in Environmental Science degree, which will enable them to transfer into upper level courses at RCNJ to pursue a Bachelor of Science in Environmental Science degree.

Bloomfield College

The articulation agreement with Bloomfield College (BC) for PCCC students who earn an A.S. in Liberal Arts Biology Option and seek to transfer into upper level courses at BC to pursue a Bachelor of Science in Biology degree.

Kean University

The articulation agreement with Kean University (KU) for PCCC graduates who earn either an A.S. in Liberal Arts Biology Option or an A.S. in Environmental Science degree. PCCC graduates will be able to transfer to KU into upper level courses to pursue either a Bachelor of Science in Biology or a choice between the Bachelor of Science in Earth Science Environmental Sustainability Option and the Bachelor of Science in Sustainability Science degrees based on the PCCC degree earned.

Deletion of Two Academic Offerings

The deletion of the Associate in Applied Science in Manufacturing in Engineering and the Certificate of Achievement in PC Basic Skills, due to the steady decline in student enrollment.
