The following are the minutes of the Board of Trustees of Passaic County Community College, held via an online Zoom web-based meeting service, on Tuesday, January 19, 2021.

#### CALL TO ORDER/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Chairman Marco called the meeting order at 7:00 p.m., and then asked everyone to join him in the Pledge of Allegiance.

President Rose stated Pursuant to the Open Public Meetings Act, notice of this meeting was given in the annual meeting notice, which was emailed to the Herald News, The Record, the Office of the County Clerk, the college community, and posted on the PCCC Website and bulletin boards on November 19, 2020.

The public may participate in this meeting only during the public portion, which takes place near the end of the meeting. To be recognized to speak, members of the public who are attending on Zoom via the web should use the raise hand function. Upon recognition by the chair, you will unmute your microphone/video. Members of the public who are attending the meeting via phone call must hit \*9 on their phone keypad to raise their hand to be recognized. Upon recognition by the Chair, they can unmute/mute their audio by using \*6 on their phone keypad. Individuals addressing the board must give their name and address in an audible tone and will have five (5) minutes to make their statement.

Comments from the public which are provided by email or written letter will be read aloud during the meeting in a manner audible to all meeting participants and the public. The time limit for public comment shall apply to comments received via email or by written letter. Such comments will be read from the beginning until the time limit is reached. The Board may pass over duplicate written and emailed comments; however, each duplicate comment shall be noted for the record with the content summarized.

### **CONSIDERATION OF MINUTES** – December 15, 2020

Chairman Marco asked if there were any corrections to the minutes for December 15, 2020. Hearing none, Trustee Glovin moved Resolution #1 – Consideration of Minutes for the December 15, 2020 board meeting; seconded by Trustee Pou. Upon roll call, Resolution #1 passed with all members present voting "yes."

#### PRESENTATION - Proposed FY 2021-2022 Budget

President Rose outlined the steps taken to produce a proposed budget for the College during the pandemic, which created more uncertainty than was typical. He noted that the most significant variable was enrollment and the tuition revenue it generates. New students were down the most. Based on calculated assumptions, the fall enrollment was calculated at 15% lower than the current budget. The budget presented does not include an increase in tuition.

Some brighter news he noted was how the County stepped up with its largest increase ever of one million dollars! President Rose also noted the change in rules for the CARES funding that would now allow those monies to be used to offset a loss in revenue. The College was slated to receive approximately \$9.0 million dollars in additional institutional funding. That funding would definitely help with the current shortfall of \$884,453 without the need to take funds from the reserves.

A few questions were raised that pertained to the CARES funding and what exactly it would cover, student debt being one of them.

President Rose then turned his attention to the expense side of the operating budget noting that the College employs 265 full-time employees, and that 25 vacant positions were eliminated from the budget. In doing that, there were no layoffs proposed for the FY2022 budget.

President Rose then reviewed both the budget for Chapter 12, which included the Rifle Camp Observatory, and the regular capital items funded through the County of Passaic.
