The following are the minutes of the Board of Trustees of Passaic County Community College, One College Boulevard, Paterson, New Jersey held on Tuesday, April 18, 2017.

CALL TO ORDER

President Rose stated that notice of the meeting was mailed to the Herald News, the Record, the Office of the County Clerk, and posted on the bulletin board of the College Boulevard building on November 16, 2016.

Chairman Nutter stated that inasmuch as adequate notice of the meeting had been given, the meeting was called to order at 7:15p.m. A copy of the agenda was reviewed and available for public inspection.

PRESENTATIONS

Passaic County Community College Honors Program

President Rose spoke briefly on the current Honors Program at the College. He then introduced Mr. Greg Fallon, Associate Dean for Learning Resources and Professor Marc Yeung, Instructor, Mathematics and Honors Program Coordinator.

Dean Fallon stated eighteen months ago, Professor Yeung led a group of fourteen faculty members and designed the Honors Program which was recently approved by the Academic Council. He highlighted the benefits which are small classes; the talented classmates who challenge each other; in depth discussions led by faculty and students and guided research. Both

explained the goals of the program along with the requirements students will need to be admitted into the honors program.

In addition, Dean Fallon spoke of the Phi Theta Kappa (PTK) Honor Society led by Professor Jennifer Gasparino, Instructor, Human Services, and PTK Advisor in which the honors' students can benefit by joining PTK.

Professor Yeung also spoke of three admission standards in which students must achieve plus maintain a 3.5 Grade Point Average (GPA). He stated that (1) current students apply, must place into college-level, and have earned no more than twelve credits. (2) Students coming from another college must have completed twelve college-level credits and have already earned a 3.5 GPA. (3) Incoming students who are recent high school graduates must place into college-level reading, writing and mathematics and submit SAT scores or take the Accuplacer test. All applicants must go through the application process. Dean Fallon stated the program was being presented to high schools, emphasizing the cost efficiency at Passaic County Community College. He noted that there are already 140 students interested in the honors program.

Dean Fallon then took the liberty and mentioned the achievements of Mr. Miguel De Jesus, Alumni Representative to the Board of Trustees, and how PTK has helped him. He also informed the Board that there were 200 inductees accepted into PTK and of that number, ninety percent will graduate.

A brief question and answer session took place.

Dr. Jacqueline Kineavy, Vice President of Academic and Student Affairs, gave a brief overview on each new academic offering.

Certificate of Achievements

She highlighted the two Certificates of Achievement, both of which are twelve credits each; the first one was in Criminal Justice Studies, wherein the credits can be used toward a

degree or Career Certificate. The second one was in Public Safety Communications which was in dispatch and has become very popular.

Changes in Nomenclature

Dr. Kineavy explained how the Nomenclature changes must be submitted to the state when changing the name of a course. The changes presented were for the A.A.S. Information Technology: Web Technology Option to its new name: A.A.S. Information Technology: Web and Mobile Development Option. And the current 30 credit Career Certificate entitled Fire Science to its new name of Fire Science Operations.

Career Certificates

Dr. Kineavy discussed the Career Certificate changes of Fire Science to Fire Science Operations, noting a new instructor was hired in September; and with such changes, it brought the curricula in line with the Fire and Emergency Higher Education Initiative (FESHI). The federal standard for these courses defines what the curriculum should be in Fire Science

Change in Status from Associate in Science in Liberal Arts-Engineering Option to Associate in Science in Engineering

And lastly, Dr. Kineavy discussed the change in degree status for the Associate in Science in Liberal Arts-Engineering Science Option to become an Associate in Science in Engineering Science degree.
