The following are the minutes of the Board of Trustees of Passaic County Community College, held via an online Zoom web-based meeting service, on Tuesday, April 21, 2020.

CALL TO ORDER/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Chairman Nutter called the meeting order at 7:00 p.m., then asked everyone to join him in the Pledge of Allegiance.

President Rose stated that notice of the meeting was emailed to the Herald News, the Record, the Office of the County Clerk, the college community, and posted on the PCCC website on April 6, 2020.

CONSIDERATION OF MINUTES – March 17, 2020

Chairman Nutter asked if there were any corrections to the minutes for March 17, 2020. Trustee Moody stated that the wording for executive session was confusing and did not make sense. Mr. Michael A. Cerone, Jr., College Counsel, read the statement out loud and agreed. The minutes were corrected to read, "since there were no matters involving personnel that needed to be discussed." Chairman Nutter then asked if there were any objections to the correction, and hearing none, he asked for motion on Resolution #1 – Consideration of Minutes for the March 17, 2020. Trustee Tanis moved Resolution #1; seconded by Trustee Moody.

Upon roll call, Resolution #1 passed with Trustee DuHaime "abstaining" and all other members present voting "yes."

PRESENTATION – COVID19 UPDATE

President Rose began his presentation noting it was not normal times in the world then briefed the Board on the many steps that have taken. Both instruction, student support, and business operations had to be converted to a remote environment. Everyone at the College pulled together to get this done. He reported that all instruction was now being delivered online or remotely.

He noted that it was a gargantuan task with almost 1,000 course sections to convert. Both our full-time and adjunct faculty have been outstanding.

Other updates provided by President Rose centered on extending the spring semester by an additional week, postponing commencement, the possibility of summer sessions taught remotely and online, the various restrictions imposed by the State, the cut in State funding of \$600,000 along with the State extending its fiscal year to September, and the unknown when normal operations would resume.

President Rose also discussed the CARES Act that was recently approved with PCCC to receive \$5.4 million dollars (\$2.7 million for students; \$2.7 million for the College). Guidelines on how that money was to be utilized were still being drafted. In addition to that funding, the PCCC Foundation was working on several scenarios to help students continue their studies. Mr. Todd Sorber, Vice President of Institutional Advancement, was leading that charge.

One final report President Rose gave was how the College was able to assist the county by supplying PPE through its nursing and EMS programs. Calls also were coming in from St. Mary's Hospital in Passaic to see if the hospital could utilize the Passaic Academic Center's Nursing Laboratories to retrain their operating room nurses to become ICU nurses.

President Rose stated that Board approval was needed for the Perkins program in order for money to be moved around since travel did not happen for the spring semester. He stated that there was money available in that grant that could be re-purposed. The reallocated funding would be used for instructional and non-instructional equipment and supplies.

President Rose highlighted one of the purchases, which was the purchase of *Chromebooks* for the students. He stated that Vice President Sorber was able to repurpose some finding in order to

move that purchase forward. Mr. Brad Morton, Vice President of Information Technology, has been working with his staff to ensure every student who requests a laptop would receive one, and that purchase would help with that project.
