The following are the minutes of the Board of Trustees of Passaic County Community College, One College Boulevard, Paterson, New Jersey, held on Tuesday, September 19, 2017.

CALL TO ORDER

President Rose stated that notice of the meeting was mailed to the Herald News, the Record, the Office of the County Clerk, and posted on the bulletin board of the College Boulevard building on November 16, 2016.

Chairman Nutter stated that inasmuch as adequate notice of the meeting had been given, the meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. A copy of the agenda was reviewed and available for public inspection.

CONSIDERATION OF MINUTES – July 18, 2017

Chairman Nutter asked for a motion on Resolution #1 – Consideration of Minutes for July 18, 2017; moved by Trustee Moody; seconded by Trustee Tanis. Upon roll call, Resolution #1 passed with all members present voting "yes."

PRESENTATIONS

Human Services Program Review

In a joint presentation, Professors Michael D'Arcangelo, Associate Professor, and Jennifer Gasparino, Instructor, both of the Human Services Department, provided an overview of their recent program review. A copy of the five year review was passed around for the Trustees

to see, while Professor D'Arcangelo noted that the program was in line with the College goals, and noted that this self-study was aligned with the Mission of the College. Both professors stated that they worked with many departments in the College to gather and analyze all the data. The data was then sent to Dr. Lisa Hale-Rose, Professor and Coordinator of Human Services, Borough of Manhattan Community College of the City of New York, who came to the campus for a site visit and spoke to students, Alumni, and faculty; and from there, offered the following three recommendations:

- 1. Explore articulation agreements with New York City Colleges;
- 2. Include the term "Social Work" in the degree title, stating it would increase enrollment; and
- 3. Review CSWE (Council Social Work Education) educational goals and objectives to ensure that PCCC's program is aligned with those competencies.

Both Professors were pleased with the outcome of their Program Review noting that that program opens doors and provides job opportunities for the College's many students.

PCCC Emergency Operations Plan

President Rose explained that the State of New Jersey requires the College to file a copy of its Emergency Operations Plan (EOP) with the state and local law enforcement every five years. He also explained that the EOP was a confidential document and not available to the public due to the detailed information it contains about the College. He also stated that the Board was required to approve its submission to the State.

Mr. Steven Hardy, Vice President of Finance and Administrative Services, provided an overview of the EOP explaining many different situations that can occur. He stated Mr. Glenn Brown, Director of Security, does have a copy of the EOP in his office and there are Emergency Response Procedures books posted all around the campus (pointing to the red booklet that was on the wall). He explained the main form of notification to alert the College of an emergency was through the Panther Alert information system, as well as, the public address systems at the College. In addition, for weather-related emergencies, radio station 880 am and television channels 4 and 12 would be engaged. Vice-President Hardy made mention numerous times that President Rose was first in the chain of command.

Mr. Hardy continued with his presentation by giving examples of a bomb threat or a fire, wherein Public Safety would be notified and they would contact law enforcement. He then presented a YouTube slide show of an Active Shooter scenario. He explained an "Active Shooter" scenario was held at the Paterson Campus in August with the College's Public Safety Department, Wanaque Police, Paterson Police and the Passaic County Sheriff's Department, along with College staff who volunteered. He then showed some of the footage from that drill.

A brief question and answer session took place.

REPORTS

<u>President</u>: President Rose started his report by acknowledging that the previous academic year had been particularly difficult due to the enrollment decline. He noted three factors that led to the decline were students being afraid to register due to their immigration status; more restrictive financial aid rules; and students who were unable to pay their bills.

The College had to adapt to the changing landscape which necessitating changing some registration policies to ensure that the College could meet its budget obligations for FY2018. He reported that it appeared that we had met our budget targets for FY18.

B. Business Items

Carl D. Perkins Audit OFAC Case #SG-0027-15

In a letter dated July 6, 2017, from the State of New Jersey, Department of Education, Chairman Nutter was notified that Passaic County Community College needed to prepare a Corrective Action Plan based on its findings from a recent audit of the Carl D. Perkins Grant. President Rose stated that PCCC was chosen for such an audit, which took several months to complete.

President Rose gave a brief overview of the Carl D. Perkins grant noting that the College was awarded \$694,735.00, and out of that amount, \$5,790.44 needed to be returned to the Department of Education, Office of Fiscal Accountability and Compliance. The factors associated with that audit outcome centered on issues such as the different rate of mileage reimbursement for travel and the public bidding process for goods and services.

Purchases of Goods and Services

President Rose stated that he would be pleased to answer any questions on the purchases, and noted that the bid for the parking lot at the Passaic Academic Center was included in the packet. He recalled that the original bid was rejected due to it being over budget, but that issue was addressed in order to move the project forward.
