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The following are the minutes of the Board of Trustees of Passaic County Community College, One College Boulevard, Paterson, New Jersey, held on Tuesday, September 20, 2016.

CALL TO ORDER

President Rose stated that notice of the meeting was mailed to the Herald News, the Record, the Office of the County Clerk, and posted on the bulletin board of the College Boulevard building on December 1, 2015.

Chairman Nutter stated that inasmuch as adequate notice of the meeting had been given, the meeting was called to order at 7:05 p.m. A copy of the agenda was reviewed and available for public inspection.

CONSIDERATION OF MINUTES – July 19, 2016

Chairman Nutter asked for a motion on Resolution #1 – Consideration of Minutes for July 19, 2016; moved by Trustee Tanis; seconded by Trustee Esquiche. Upon roll call, Resolution #1 passed with all members present voting "yes."

PRESENTATIONS

Advancing the PCCC Mission through Grant-funded Initiatives (2016)

President Rose introduced Mr. Todd Sorber, Executive Director of Institutional Advancement, and stated he was the best known grants writer in the State of New Jersey. He noted that through his efforts, the College has been able to fund initiatives that otherwise would not have taken place.

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Mr. Sorber, through a Power Point and video presentation, provided a comprehensive summary of all the grant funded activities at the College. Those activities involve students both within and outside of the College that would not have been possible if it weren't for the grant funding the College has received. He also noted that the age of the students being serviced starts with middle school-aged children, continues into College level and even adulthood, especially in the area of workforce training.

Mr. Sorber highlighted some of the programs wherein they center on college preparedness, readiness, and completion; STEM education, mentoring, and health professions, to name a few. The grants below were those presented that evening and included the following:

Mr. Michael A. Cerone, Jr., College Counsel, presented the background information as it pertained to the inception and eventual approval of the Responsible Contractor's Resolution. He noted that based on recent advisories and experience, he advised the Board that a repeal was prudent. President Rose agreed.

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Questions raised pertained to the food costs for the new Culinary Arts Program, the Shuttle bus to Wanaque and how that was working out, the Courtyard elevator, and the gym floor, to highlight a few. A discrepancy existed in the architect's recommendation wherein the recommendation was just for the base bid of \$568,000.00 without the alternates, which differed from the amount of \$646,000.00 that was being recommended in the packet.

A further discussion was then held to clarify the bidding process. Mr. Steven Hardy, Vice President for Finance and Administrative Services, informed the Board that he would return with the necessary information to answer the questions raised.

Memorandum of Understanding Between Passaic County Community College And United Way of Passaic County

Purpose

Passaic County Community College and the United Way of Passaic County (UWPC) are continuing this partnership agreement for the purpose of creating an innovative retail and service-industry training hub in the heart of Passaic County. This project is designed to enable Workfirst New Jersey clients who are currently receiving Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) and/or General Assistance (GA) an opportunity to explore hands-on career training in the retail and customer-service sector. This partnership will also launch a social enterprise in downtown Paterson, New Jersey.

Term

This agreement will be in effect from July 1, 2016 – June 30, 2017.

Roles & Responsibilities

Passaic County Community College (PCCC) will fulfill the following roles and responsibilities:

- PCCC is the contractor to Passaic County One Stop Career Center, responsible for providing workforce training services and placement referral to 60 participants during the term. PCCC will provide all required reports to Passaic County One Stop Career Center.
- PCCC will provide classroom training and preparation for retail certification to up to 60 participants.
- PCCC will support curriculum development and deployment, contextualization, career counseling, job development, and all of required paperwork for all participants and program implementation.
- PCCC will refer qualified students to the UWPC thrift store for experiential, hands-on training to prepare each participant to take full-time employment in the sector.
- PCCC will employ staff to train and coach participants in the classroom and onsite at training locations.
- PCCC will ensure that Individuals participate in work readiness and life skills training activities.
- PCCC will provide to the UWPC \$120,000 through its Workfirst New Jersey Direct Award to support the establishment of a thrift store/retail employment training facility.
- PCCC will disburse Workfirst NJ resources to the UWPC on a monthly basis.
- PCCC will provide information to trainee participants about their coverage and benefits as provided by Passaic County One Stop Career Center.

United Way of Passaic County (UWPC) will fulfill the following roles and responsibilities:

- UWPC will establish a retail thrift store in Passaic County, with funds provided by PCCC.
- UWPC will receive and place students referred by PCCC, into employment training positions at the store.
- UWPC will conduct screening of trainee candidates prior to placement in the store, in accordance with generally accepted employment practices in the retail sector. Candidates who cannot meet the screening requirements of the store will be referred to PCCC for corrective action.
- UWPC will provide daily supervision of the trainees, including providing task instruction, coaching and correction, scheduling, and on-site training. Trainees will be accountable to UWPC staff for the attendance and performance during their training period at the UWPC store.
- UWPC will refer trainees who need further support with job skills and /or life skills to PCCC program staff.
- UWPC will refer back to PCCC any trainee who cannot meet the minimum work requirements established by the program.
- UWPC will notify appropriate authorities if any trainee violates any local, state or federal law.
- UWPC will provide general management of the store and operations, including merchandising, accounting, advertising and promotions, warehousing, and staffing of paid employees.
- UWPC will provide all requested record-keeping regarding participation of trainees to PCCC.
- UWPC will maintain liability insurance to cover any claim for accidents or injuries that occur at the store location.
- UWPC will maintain workers' comp coverage to cover its own W2 employees and volunteers working at the store.
