The following are the minutes of the Board of Trustees of Passaic County Community College, held via an online Zoom web-based meeting service, on Tuesday, September 15, 2020.

## CALL TO ORDER/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Chairman Nutter called the meeting order at 7:21 p.m., and then asked everyone to join him in the Pledge of Allegiance.

President Rose stated notice of the meeting was emailed to the Herald News, the Record, the Office of the County Clerk, the college community, and posted on the PCCC website on September 8, 2020.

### CONSIDERATION OF MINUTES – August 18, 2020

Chairman Nutter asked if there were any corrections to the minutes for August 18, 2020. Hearing none, Chairman Nutter then asked for motion on Resolution #1 – Consideration of Minutes for the August 18, 2020 board meeting. Trustee Marco moved Resolution #1; seconded by Trustee Tanis. Upon roll call, Resolution #1 passed with all members present voting "yes."

# PRESENTATION - Update on Fall Restart Plan

Prior to the President presenting his update on the Fall Restart Plan, he had the pleasure of introducing Ms. Sony Ballem, the new Alumni Representative to the Board of Trustees, who was

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voted in by the recent graduating class of 2020. President Rose noted that Ms. Ballem was no stranger to the College due to the various roles she has held.

Ms. Ballem then provided a brief overview of her accomplishments, which included graduating this past May with in Associate's Degree in Information Technology, and how she was currently enrolled at NJIT to continue her studies. She noted too that she was taking courses at PCCC as a member of the Alumni Association.

President Rose began his presentation by stating how nice it was to see students back on campus. While enrollment was still down (particularly ELS population and new students), he was very pleased that a majority of returning students came back. In addition to the current 15-week semester, a 12-week semester would begin on September 30. He noted that having that additional semester would possibly help enrollment to increase.

President Rose also stated that our commitment was to not let the current situation affect the College in moving forward. With that said, two vice presidents would present their respective annual goals for the upcoming year, and in October, the other two vice presidents would present their respective divisions' goals.

# Academic Affairs and Institutional Advancement Annual Plans

The following annual plans were presented by Dr. Jacqueline Kineavy (Vice President, Academic and Student Affairs), and Mr. Todd Sorber (Vice President, Institutional Advancement) via PowerPoint presentations. Both presentations displayed the synergy between the two departments with the goal of student success its main component and aligned with the Strategic Plan for Passaic County Community College. Highlights of each plan are as follows:

Dr. Kineavy began with a review of the course schedule with needed revisions by a consultant, as well as revisions to the current registration/advisement process, which includes the Student Planning Module, expanded course delivery, and prior learning assessment. In addition to those revisions, new program development and implementation was being researched. Those new programs include an Ultrasound Technology degree, Hemodialysis Technician Certificate, and Welding; Occupational Therapy Assistant and Physical Therapy Assistant were also being looked into.

Dr. Kineavy then presented the partnership that PCCC has with Ramapo College of New Jersey and its 3 + 1 Program, which currently involves Criminal Justice, Humanities, and Psychology, and proposes next to offer Biology and Data Science. The 2 + 2 program with Ramapo allows students who earn an A.S. in Human Services to continue their studies at Ramapo in order to earn their B.S.W. (implementation January 2021). Additional future collaborations are with Cold Spring Harbor for a DNA Learning Center; and, to expand early college initiatives with the Passaic Preparatory Academy and Passaic High School.

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Vice President Sorber stated that his updates centered on three divisions in his area which were grants, the PCCC Foundation, and Marketing. He noted too that the new grants awarded all align with the Strategic Goals for the College, and consisted of the following. Before he began his presentation, President Rose noted the invaluable help of Congressman Bill Pascrell, Jr. in securing these grants for the College stating that the College has three Title V grants, which was unheard of!

The newly funded grants for 2020-2021 were for Student Support Services (SSS), which serves low-income, first generation college students; and Developing Hispanic Servicing Institutions (DHSI), which serves to expand educational opportunities for, and improve the educational attainment of, Hispanic and low-income students. Both of these awards are from the U.S, Department of Education. It is worthy to note that these two grants have increased in serving size to 420 students in the areas of ESL and SSS STEM/Health Science, as well as expanding on the model partnership with Ramapo College.

Vice President Sorber than elaborated on PCCC's new fundraising campaign entitled, "500 Stories of Hope Scholarship Campaign" which entails establishing 500 new scholarship opportunities for the 2020-2021 academic year. So far, \$105,000 has been raised. In addition, along with that new initiative, he asked all to view the newly updated College website and noted the extraordinary partnership between Marketing and Information Technology.

Vice President Sorber thanked all those involved in all the various divisions for their invaluable contributions. At this time, Trustee Trivedi committed to creating a new scholarship for \$500 from him and his wife; Trustee Smith committed to \$300. President Rose thanked Vice President Sorber for all his hard work and dedication and that no other college has what he has. He noted too that PCCC was the only college that has three SSS grants, and once a college was awarded such, the likelihood of continuation was most positive!!

#### EXECUTIVE SESSION

Chairman Nutter asked if there was a need for an executive session. Mr. Michael A. Cerone, Jr., College Counsel stated that an executive session was not needed and would present the issue in public.

Mr. Cerone gave the background on an RFP for three new large flagpoles on Broadway, and other smaller ones on the Paterson campus. The three large flagpoles were discolored from the start and Mr. Cerone stated he contacted the vendor several times to fix the problem but to no avail. The vendor actually told him to have the College pay him the balance and he would then come and fix the problem. A letter recently received from Nebraska was demanding payment for the overdue invoice with a 1.5% interest charge. Mr. Cerone had to inform that lawyer from Nebraska that they have no jurisdiction in New Jersey, and that the original RFP did not state what she was referencing. He currently was waiting to hear back.
