The following are the minutes of the Board of Trustees of Passaic County Community College, One College Boulevard, Paterson, New Jersey, held on Tuesday, January 17, 2023.

#### CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Marco called the meeting to order at 6:02 p.m., and then asked everyone to join him in the Pledge of Allegiance.

President Rose stated pursuant to the Open Public Meetings Act, notice of this notice meeting was emailed to the Herald News, the Record, the Office of the County Clerk, and posted on the bulletin board of the College Boulevard building in its Annual Meeting Notice on December 5, 2022.

#### CONSIDERATION OF MINUTES – December 20, 2022

Chairman Marco asked if there were any corrections to the minutes for December 20, 2022. Hearing none, Trustee Nutter moved Resolution #1 – Consideration of Minutes for the December 20, 2022 board meeting; seconded by Trustee Glovin. Upon roll call, Resolution #1 passed with Trustee Montanez-Diodonet "abstaining" and all members present voting "yes."

#### **PRESENTATIONS**

Donohue, Gironda, Doria & Tomkins, LLC Audit Report

The team of Ms.Sara Zarineh, Audit Manager, and Mr. Fred Tomkins, Partner, from the auditing firm of Donohue, Gironda, Doria, & Tomkins, presented the College Audit Report for the Fiscal Year ending June 30, 2022.

Ms. Zarineh stated that this is an unqualified audit. She further stated that there were no issues in completing the audit.

In her opening statement, she noted that the audit was performed by current auditing standards. She thanked President Rose and his accounting team for all their cooperation. Ms. Zarineh then went through the audit noting specific pages and/or programs the College engaged in through that year. A brief question and answer then took place.

#### REPORTS

Chairman/President: No oral report given.

#### INSTRUCTIONAL ITEM

New Degree Program: Associate in Applied Science, Supply Chain Management

President Rose asked Dr. Jacqueline Kineavy, Senior Vice President for Academic and Student Affairs, to present the new sixty (60) credit Associate in Applied Science Degree in Supply Chain Management.

Dr. Kineavy briefed the Board on the new academic program stating that the new degree in Supply Chain Management leads directly to employment after the student completes the requirements. She further stated that the program would be submitted to the State once it receives approval by the Board. The Consultant's Report was included in the packet, and a faculty member and adjuncts were already lined up to teach the program. Dr. Kineavy also stated that a staff member at the College already has an earned Master's Degree for this program, which would be very beneficial to the College and its students.

#### **BUISNESS ITEMS**

President Rose stated that there was nothing of significance to report on in the purchases of goods and services, so he asked College Counsel Mr. Michael A. Cerone, Jr. to present an item that the College has been working on for some time, which was the Selection of an Energy Consultant.

Mr. Cerone referenced the discussion from last month's meeting noting the current cost-saving program the State has through an ESIP. ESCO has a program that would take 24-36 months to perform a local energy audit. In order to proceed, the firm of Schneider Electric was being recommended for that service. President Rose noted that significant savings could be realized on all campuses in participating in that program.
