

The following are the minutes of the Board of Trustees of Passaic County Community College, One College Boulevard, Paterson, New Jersey, held on Tuesday, March 21, 2023.

CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Marco called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m., and then asked everyone to join him in the Pledge of Allegiance.

President Rose stated pursuant to the Open Public Meetings Act, notice of this notice meeting was emailed to the Herald News, the Record, the Office of the County Clerk, and posted on the bulletin board of the College Boulevard building in its Annual Meeting Notice on December 5, 2022.

CONSIDERATION OF MINUTES –February 21, 2023

Chairman Marco asked if there were any corrections to the minutes for February 21, 2023. Hearing none, Vice Chair Tanis moved Resolution #1 – Consideration of Minutes for the February 21, 2023 board meeting; seconded by Trustee Pou. Upon roll call, Resolution #1 passed with all members present voting “yes.”

PRESENTATIONS

Career Services Program Review

Mr. Tom Moore, Assistant Dean for Career, Professional Readiness, and Experiential Learning, provided an overview of the Career Services Program. He explained the process

of an internal review and then an external review by an external program reviewer knowledgeable in that field. A brief question and answer period then took place.

After Mr. Moore's presentation, President Rose informed the board that a visit from the Middle States Commission on Higher Education would visit the College for its Self-Study review a year from now, and the Board would be asked questions such as, "What do we know about the College?" The example of program reviews was given, and he noted that it was not just limited to academic programs but administrative ones as well, such as tonight's presentation.

REPORTS

President: President Rose asked Vice President Steven Hardy, of the office of Finance and Administrative Services, to walk the board through the Statement of Revenue and Expenditures, a.k.a. the Variance Report. Vice President Hardy explained the different columns of numbers in the report noting each one's significance. Several of the trustees had questions about the revenue stream and the surplus stated from last month.

President Rose then reported on two additional items, the first one was disappointment in the Governor's proposed budget for higher education. The Governor proposed level funding for community colleges. However, the Community College Opportunity Grant (CCOG), was a bright spot in the Governor's proposed budget. The Governor proposed expanding the family income eligibility for CCOG to \$100,000. Students from families with adjusted gross incomes from \$80,000 to \$100,000 would be eligible for a grant covering 1/3 of their tuition. CCOG was a campaign promise that the Governor made when he first ran for office and it is one that he clearly fulfilled. He along with Chairman Marco stated that the New Jersey Council of County Colleges discussed an Advocacy campaign that the trustees would be involved with, and information would be forthcoming.

Trustee Smith left the meeting at 6:40 p.m.

Chairman: No oral report given.

DISCUSSION AGENDA

INSTRUCTIONAL ITEM

Dr. Jacqueline Kineavy, Senior Vice President for Academic and Student Affairs, presented the new sixty-credit degree program entitled the Associate in Applied Science Degree in Surgical Technology. She explained the entire approval process noting that she hopes to have that program in place this coming fall. It would be housed in the Passaic Academic Center.

As a side note, President Rose had Ms. Patricia Medeiros, the director of the Passaic Academic Center announce that the Valley Hospital contacted her to have their Medical Assistants trained by the College.

Trustee Smith returned at 6:49 p.m.

BUSINESS ITEMS – Purchase of Goods and Services

President Rose stated that there was nothing out of the ordinary to report on in the purchases of goods and services. He did inform the board that a special meeting may need to be called between now and the next meeting to present and approve a bid for the renovation of the Child Development Center. There was just a small window of time to get that project done. The meeting would be held via Zoom.

SPECIAL REGOGNITION

President Rose presented the Resolution for former Trustee Yolanda Esquiche noting her many years of service and dedication to the College.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Chairman Marco asked if there was a need for an executive session, which President Rose stated there was not, but he did take a moment to acknowledge the retirement of Dr. Sharon Goldstein, Associate Vice President/Dean of Student Affairs. He noted her valuable contributions to the College.
